1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Collective Bargaining – Technical**
3 **Unit**

4 **MC/PG 114–19**

5 FOR the purpose of establishing a separate technical collective bargaining unit within the
6 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission; altering a provision of law that had
7 established a certain joint office/technical collective bargaining unit to establish a
8 separate office collective bargaining unit; and generally relating to collective
9 bargaining involving the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Public Utilities**

2 (a) (1) (i) In this subsection the following words have the meanings
3 indicated.

4 (ii) “Confidential employee” means an employee who assists or acts
5 in a confidential capacity with respect to an individual who formulates, determines, or
6 implements management policies in the field of labor–management relations.

7 (iii) “Probationary employee” means a Commission merit system
8 employee during the employee’s initial probationary period after hiring.

9 (2) The rights granted to Commission merit system employees under this
10 subtitle do not apply to:

11 (i) attorneys in the Office of the General Counsel;

12 (ii) confidential employees;

13 (iii) probationary employees;

14 (iv) employees in the Office of the General Manager;

15 (v) employees in the Internal Audit Office;

16 (vi) employees in the Office of the Secretary; or

17 (vii) supervisors, as defined in § 2(11) of the National Labor Relations
18 Act, 29 U.S.C. § 152(11).

19 (b) (1) Commission employees are divided into [four] **FIVE** bargaining units
20 consisting of:

21 (i) an [office/technical] **OFFICE** unit that includes:

22 1. office classification titles in which employees are
23 responsible for internal and external communications, recording and retrieving
24 information, and paperwork required in an office;

1 2. [technical classification titles in which employees have a
2 combination of basic scientific or technical knowledge and manual skill that is usually
3 acquired through specialized postsecondary school education or through equivalent
4 on-the-job training;

5 3.] paraprofessional classification titles in which employees
6 perform, in a supportive role, some of the duties of a professional or a technician but that
7 usually require less formal training or experience than those duties performed by those
8 with professional or technical status; and

9 [4.] 3. all other nonprofessional job titles currently
10 unrepresented by any other union;

11 (ii) a professional unit that includes professional classification titles
12 in which employees have special or theoretical knowledge that is usually acquired through
13 college training or other training that provides comparable knowledge or work experience;

14 (iii) a service, labor, and trade unit that includes:

15 1. classification titles in which employees:

16 A. perform service and maintenance;

17 B. may operate specialized machinery or heavy equipment;

18 and

19 C. have duties that contribute to the comfort and convenience
20 of the public or to the upkeep and care of Commission buildings, facilities, or grounds;

21 2. classification titles in which employees are required to
22 have a special manual skill and thorough knowledge of processes that are required through
23 on-the-job training, experience, apprenticeship, or other formal training programs; and

24 3. classification titles included in the service, labor, and
25 trade bargaining unit as constituted on January 1, 2003; [and]

26 (iv) a law enforcement unit that includes Commission police officers;

1 AND

2 (V) A TECHNICAL UNIT THAT INCLUDES TECHNICAL
3 CLASSIFICATION TITLES IN WHICH EMPLOYEES HAVE A COMBINATION OF BASIC
4 SCIENTIFIC OR TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGE AND MANUAL SKILL THAT IS USUALLY
5 ACQUIRED THROUGH SPECIALIZED POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL EDUCATION OR
6 THROUGH EQUIVALENT ON-THE-JOB TRAINING.

7 (2) If a single employee organization is certified to represent more than one
8 bargaining unit, the Commission shall negotiate a single contract with that organization
9 covering all employees the organization represents.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2019.
