AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 233
(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, after “**License**” insert “**and Licenses in the Town of Kensington**”; in line 6, after “Commission;” insert “increasing the number of alcoholic beverages licenses that the Board of License Commissioners is authorized to issue in the Town of Kensington;”; in line 10, after “25–102” insert “and 25–1604(a)”; and in line 15, after “25–405” insert “and 25–1604(c) and (g)”.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 3, after line 10, insert:

“25–1604.

(a) This section applies only to Kensington.

(c) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Board may issue, in aggregate, not more than [eight] 20 Class A–K (off–sale) beer and wine licenses.

(2) The Board, by majority vote, may issue one additional Class A–K beer and wine license if there is:

(i) a public hearing before the town council; and

(ii) a subsequent request made by the town council.

(3) A Class A–K beer and wine license holder may sell beer and wine for off–premises consumption Monday through Sunday, from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

(g) The Board may issue, in aggregate, not more than [eight] **20** licenses from among the following types:

- (1) a Class B–K beer and wine license;
- (2) a Class B–K beer, wine, and liquor license;
- (3) a Class BD–BWL license;
- (4) a Class C beer and wine license;
- (5) a Class D–K beer license;
- (6) a Class D–K beer and wine license; and
- (7) a Class H beer and wine license.”.
