- 1 (2) (i) On receipt of the capital and operating budgets and 2 recommendations from the county councils, the Commission shall approve a rate schedule.
- 3 (ii) In approving a rate schedule the Commission shall consider the 4 proposed rate changes jointly recommended by the county councils.
- 5 (3) Subject to § 25–101 of this article, the rates for water service charges 6 and sewer usage charges shall be uniform throughout the sanitary district.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2016.
